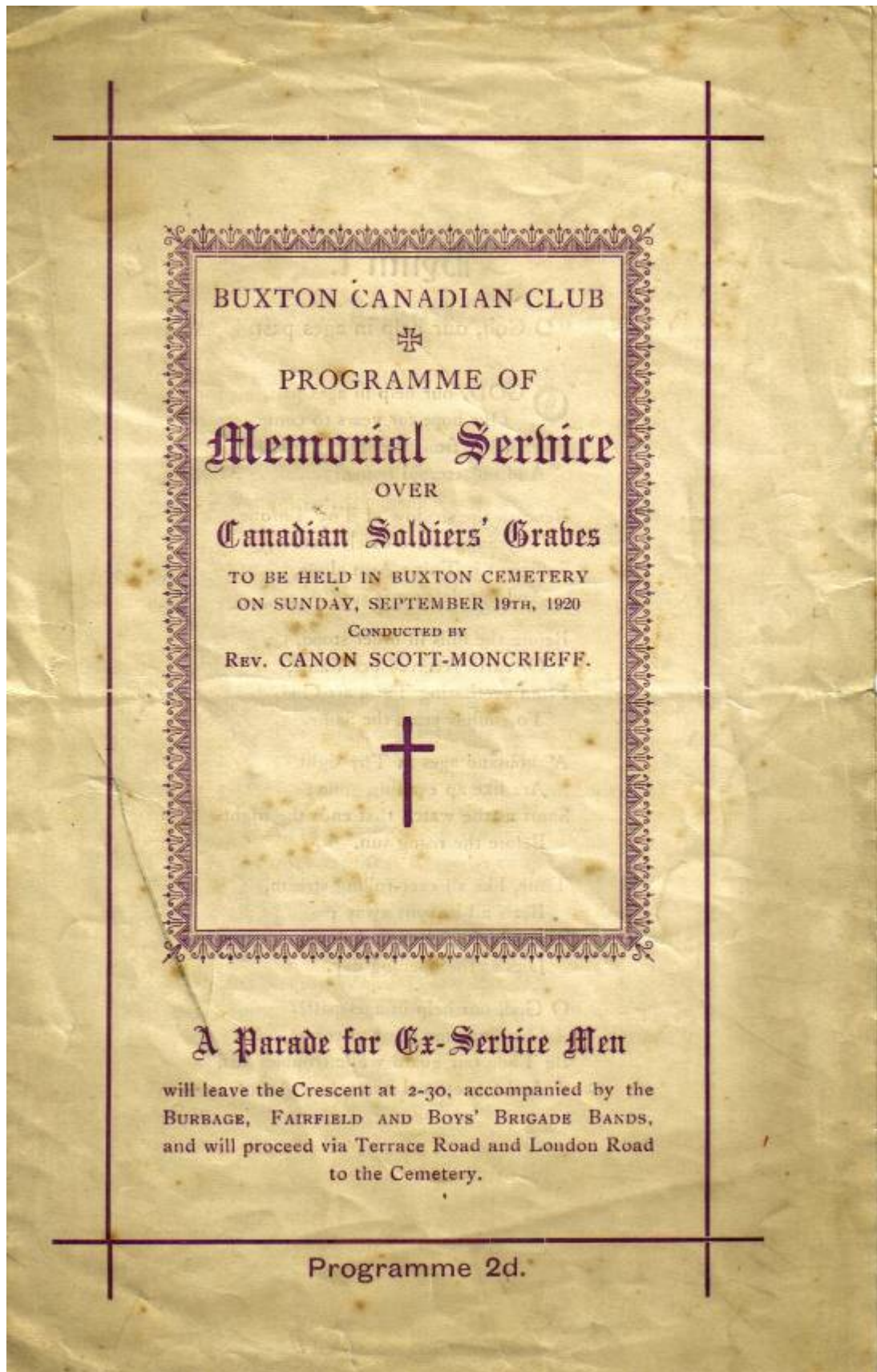

Buxton Cemetery, 19 September 1920**

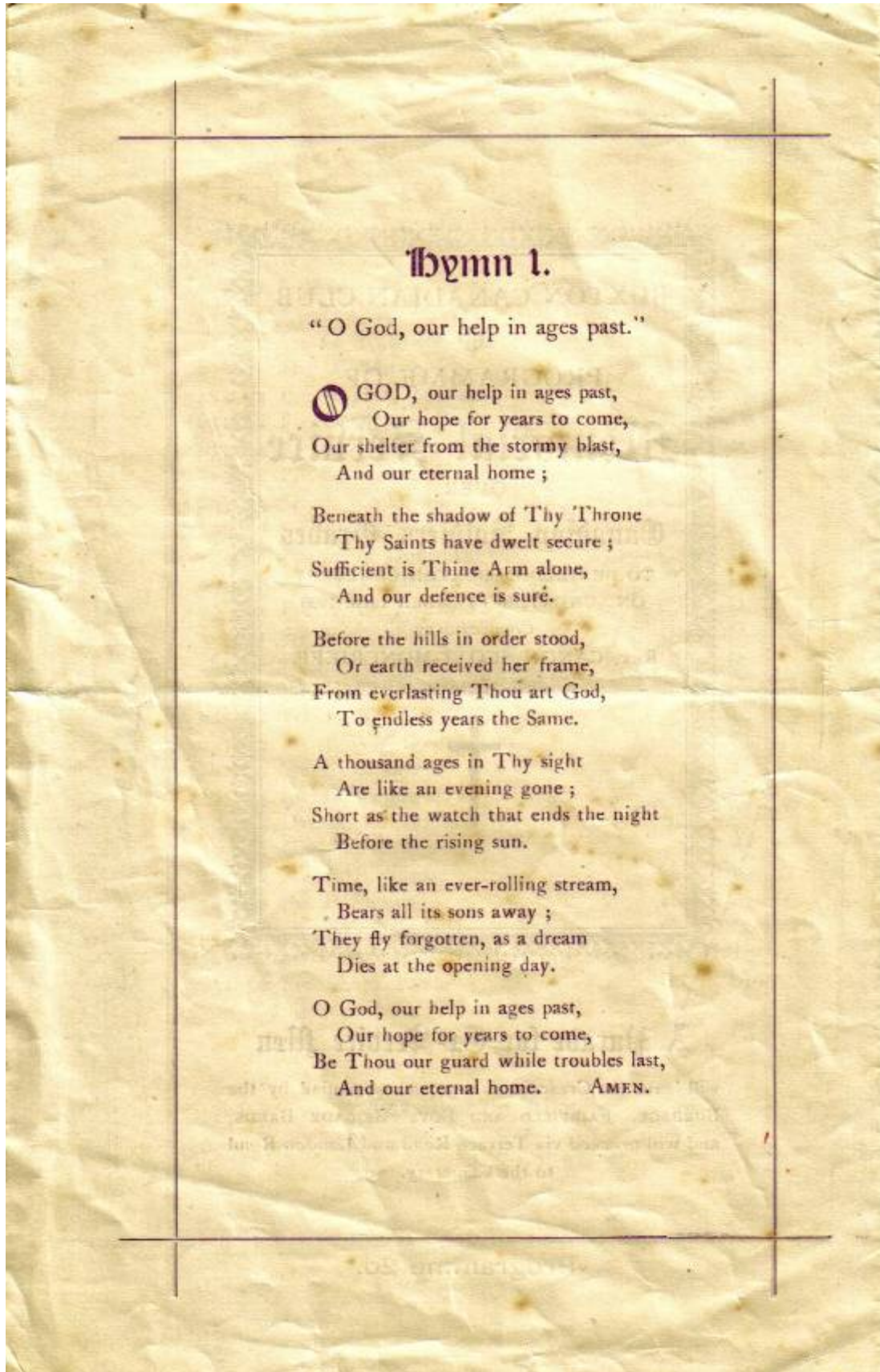

And our eternal home ;

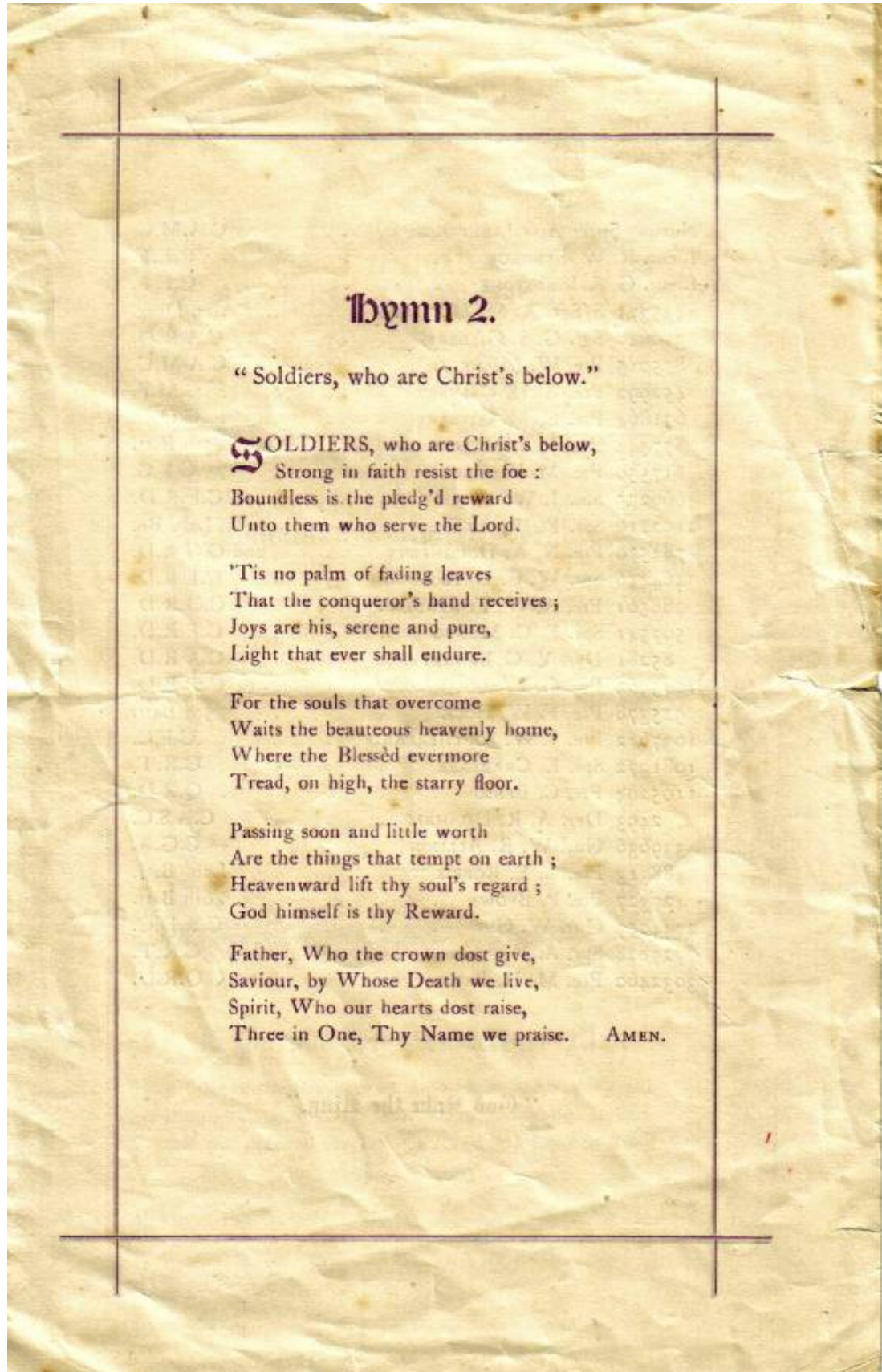
Beneath the shadow of Thy Throne
